Darren believes passionately that TELUS' greatest asset is its 130,000 team members around the globe. In this regard, TELUS is consistently recognized for its global leadership in respect of team engagement and has been ranked number one in the world for a company of its size and composition according to third-party surveyor, Kincentric.


